RONALD E. ROGERS began his teaching career as Assistant Band Director at Rutledge High School followed by a tenure as Band Director at Doyle High School in Knoxville. Rogers served as Director of Bands at Farragut High School for many years where he was selected Teacher of the year. Most recently, Rogers served as Band Director at William Blunt High School before his retirement after 37 years of teaching. Throughout his career, Rogers' bands were recognized as some of the finest marching and concert organizations in the area consistently receiving superior ratings both outdoors and indoors at major state and national events. His students always received notable recognition for their outstanding musical excellence.

Ron Rogers' professional activities are extensive having served several years as President of the ETBOA, as President of the Tennessee Secondary Schools Band Director's Association, and as President of the Tennessee Bandmasters Association. He also served as President of TMEA, as Tennessee State Chair for the National Band Association, and on the board of control for TMEA.

Ron Rogers was selected as a finalist for the Tennessee Humanities "Teacher of the Year" and has been the recipient of the National Band Association's "Citation of Excellence" on four separate occasions. He is an elected member of Phi Beta Mu and was recognized by the Tennessee House of Representatives and Senate for his "outstanding career and extraordinary impact of both teachers and students." Currently, he remains very active as a clinician and adjudicator and has judged band festivals and conducted clinics in over a dozen states and Europe plus contributing many magazine articles.
